
CARSON CITY SCHOOLS FOUNDATION To Support Jump Start Program April 8, 2021



Supporting the Jump Start program: The grant funding for the joint program with WNC was cancelled. Now the District will fund CCSD's portion of the costs through the Distributive Student Account (DSA) as part of the commitment to College and Career Ready curriculum.

Although WNC was able to help with a significant reduction in student fees, students will face new costs for textbooks and materials for the up-coming year. With the projected enrollment of 125 students the Carson City Schools Foundation Board committed to funding textbooks and materials for Jump Start for next year.

The Foundation agreed to seek additional funding by offering to match community donations that sponsor students for Jump Start participation. Students will remain anonymous, but such "targeted" donations will be applied and matched. If all covered Jump Start costs are funded, any additional funds will go towards other established Foundation Grant programs.

- Step 1: Discuss eligibility with high school counselor/administrator.
- Step 2: Currently enrolled or completed Algebra II with a qualifying grade.
- Step 3: Submit the WNC Admissions application @ wnc.edu
- Step 4: Submit your <u>Jump Start College application</u> to your high school.
- Step 7: WNC and high school representatives interview student and parents for final approval.
- Step 8: <u>Register</u> for fall classes.
- Step 9: Participate in New Student Orientation.
