## Foundation Awards \$8,530 in Grants to Support Students, Educators

Carson City, Nev. (April 3, 2024) — The Carson City School District, on behalf of the Carson City Schools Foundation, is pleased to announce mini and department grant winners for Spring 2024. Each semester, the foundation gives back to educators and students alike. This last semester, CCSF awarded a total of \$8,530 in mini-grants as well as grants for a department, school or grade-level projects.

In 2023, the Carson City Schools Foundation contributed \$46,324. Since 2017, the foundation has contributed nearly \$155,000 to students and educators in Carson City.
